Computer-based MAT

The Miller Analogies Test (MAT) is a high-level analytic ability test requiring the solution of problems stated as analogies. Most of the analogies on the MAT are verbal analogies, and a few are quantitative. The test consists of 120 partial analogies that are to be completed in 60 minutes. The MAT is intended to assess your ability to recognize relationships between ideas, your fluency in the English language, and your general knowledge of literature, philosophy, history, science, mathematics, and fine arts.

The MAT is one choice of exams for regular (R) and/or provisional (P) admission to graduate degrees in the following academic fields at AASU:

Criminal Justice (R,P) Nursing (R,P) Communicative Disorders (R,P)
Public Health (R,P) Health Services Admin. (P) Sports Medicine (R,P)

Report to University Hall, Room 112 *at least 10-15 minutes before the start of the exam on your test date.* See the campus map on reverse side. Bring two forms of identification, one of which must be a government issued ID. The test session will be approximately 90 minutes.

Requesting a Refund

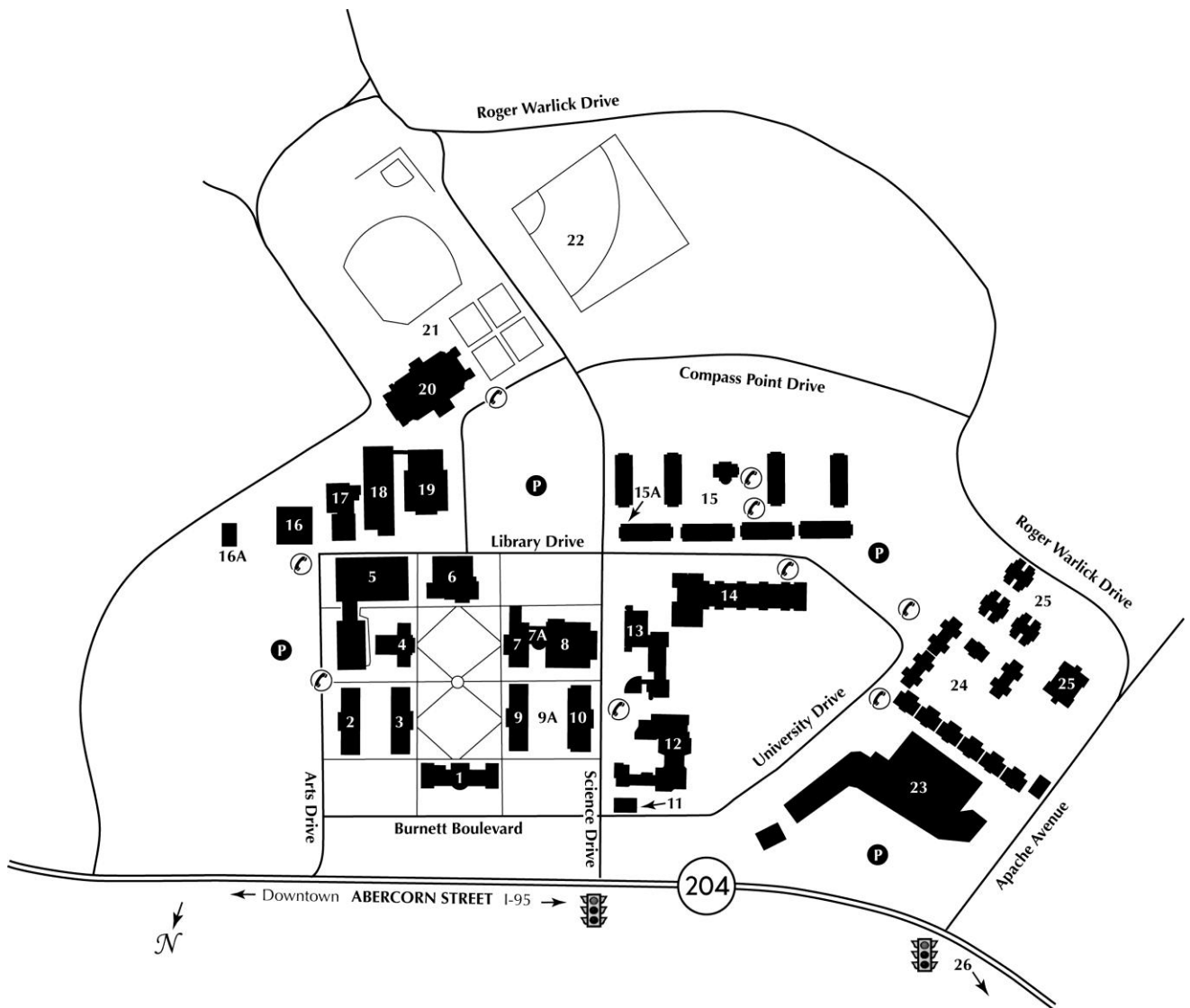
